Hello and welcome future Villa Park High School Spartans!!

We hope that you had a safe and restful Spring Break and that you have transitioned to the new norm that is distance learning. We are confident that this will pass and we will return to the daily routines we are most comfortable with. In the meantime, we are introducing some practices for the short term that will allow us to return to normal procedures when the time allows for it.

Our priority is to complete the remaining school year with the available remote methods that teachers have implemented so please make sure you have been communicating with your current teachers and remaining on top of your studies. Additionally, we are working to ensure that we are set to open the 2020-2021 school year with few glitches. In order to do so, we want to be sure that we have classes selected for students to begin the year. Some of you have already input classes on-line prior to the school format change and others have emailed copies of the purple "Course Request" forms to us. As a Counseling Department, we have completed course requests for all students currently assigned to Villa Park High School (VPHS) as their school of residence. Students that are choosing to open enroll at VPHS have been assigned classes if all of the open enrollment process has been completed. Please be aware that these selections are preliminary and are used to determine the number of sections we will need. Requests for teachers and/or periods should not be made as they will not be considered. If no course request was submitted then the counselor has completed a selection of classes based upon previous coursework, grades, etc. You can email your counselor if you want to make any changes and as always, you can make changes up until and at the summer orientation in mid-August.

Important notes:

1. 9th grade students must have a minimum of six classes. Four of the six classes must be on campus. Online, SCC classes and/or select zero period classes will not count toward the four
2. 9th graders will not be assigned a zero period unless it is requested.
3. Students will not be placed in a sport (unless requesting Football)...they will be enrolled in PE/Dance
4. Dual Enrollment courses offered through SCC do not count towards regular enrollment. These classes are taken in addition to VPHS classes and are offered after school. We work closely with SCC and can communicate your desire to take their courses
